
## COMPOSITION BOOK COVER FROM SUSAN STRUMPF

Make a cover using up leftover blocks and scraps from your quilt projects. This cover fits a standard size composition notebook (9.75 x 7.5") which can be easily replaced when its time for a new notebook!

## Fabric requirements:

Fusible Fleece measuring 16.75" x 11"

Outside cover – you will need fabric measuring approximately 16.75" x 11" Lining – two pieces measuring 7.5" x 11" and one piece measuring 5" x 11" Binding – 2.5" strips measuring approximately 60" in length, pressed in half





## Create a composition book cover:

Create your cover (exterior panel)— it can be as simple as a single fabric that you want to feature, or it can incorporate piecing or appliqué. When designing your cover, keep in mind that the midpoint of the cover, where it will fold in half, will be at about  $8\ 3/8$ " (so  $8.25\ -\ 8.5$ " is shown as a dashed line area for reference.)

Shown below are 2 layouts for ROUGH ideas and measures. The sizes listed here were CUT size, not finished size. Use your scraps to have fun and create your own composition!





4 ½ x 16 ¾"
3 ½ x 2" Flying Geese
4 ¼ x 16 ¾"


When the exterior cover composition is complete, fuse your exterior fabric (approximately 16.75" x 11") to the fusible fleece. Trim as needed to 'square up' your rectangle. Add machine quilting, as desired.

OR

Place exterior panel right side down. Place the 5" x 11" piece of lining fabric right side up, in the center of the fleece.








On both side panels (measuring 7.5" x 11"), turn under one 11" edge and press.

Top stitch if desired with a straight stitch or a decorative stitch.
